
Saturday Daytime Lane Closures Scheduled on U.S. Highway 50

Paving at Two Crossover Locations in Sacramento

SACRAMENTO – Caltrans is alerting motorists about daytime lane closures on eastbound and westbound U.S. Highway 50 (US-50) in Sacramento on **Saturday, February 10th** to pave in the median area.

These concrete repairs are part of the \$483.5 million project U.S. Highway 50 Design-Build Multimodal Corridor Enhancement Project (also known as the Fix50 Highway Enhancement Project), which includes \$390.2 million from Senate Bill 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017. SB-1 was signed into law on April 28, 2017. This legislative package invests \$5.4 billion annually to fix roads, freeways and bridges in communities across California and puts more dollars toward transit and safety.

The #1 lane on westbound US-50 from Watt Avenue to 65th Street, and the #1 lane on eastbound US-50 from 59th Street to Howe Avenue are scheduled to closed from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday.

This paving work must be performed during the daytime because of cold overnight temperatures. These weekend closures will reduce the need for prolonged construction operations, expediting the work schedule on the project.

Saturday's schedule is subject to change due to weather, traffic incidents, availability of equipment and/or materials, and construction related issues.

For current road conditions, motorists are encouraged to check <u>Caltrans' QuickMap</u> or download the QuickMap app from the <u>App Store</u> or <u>Google Play</u> before traveling.
